SRNS' Operations and Construction Divisions Receive Palmetto Shining Star Awards

AIKEN, S.C. April 26, 2017 – Savannah River Nuclear Solutions (SRNS) operations and construction divisions were awarded Palmetto Shining Star Awards from the S.C. Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation on Tuesday at an awards ceremony held in Columbia.

Combined, the SRNS' operations and construction divisions worked more than 9.7 million hours during calendar year 2016, finishing out the year with an employee injury rate that was significantly less than the national incidence rate.

For a large company that conducts highly technical and hazardous work, the SRNS safety performance is considered to be "World Class" based on industry standards.

"We're proud of our employees earning this recognition" said Stuart MacVean, SRNS President and CEO. "Our culture is nurtured and sustained by frontline workers who are driven by a genuine desire to perform their work as safely as possible."

The Palmetto Shining Star award is bestowed upon South Carolina companies that complete a calendar year without a recordable injury or illness, are at least 75 percent below the national incidence rate, or worked one million or more safe work hours without a lost-time injury.
